**The Bold North Conference on Reformed Theology to Host "Covenant Theology and the Promised Messiah" Event Nov. 5-6 to Teach the Key to Bible Interpretation**

**St. Paul, Minn. - October 8, 2021** - In partnership with the Alliance of Confessing Evangelicals, the Bold North Conference on Reformed Theology will host its third annual event, "Covenant Theology and the Promised Messiah," Nov. 5-6 at Mission Orthodox Presbyterian Church at 1040 Como Ave. in St Paul, Minn. Cost is \$25 per registrant; \$15 for special registrations. The conference will host four sessions given by ordained ministers, Rev. Camden Bucey and Rev. James Cassidy, who will lead studies from Genesis to Revelation and unpack the nature of the two main covenants in the Bible. They explain, "Believers will become better equipped to rightly divide the Word of Truth. Covenant stands at the center of all true religion between God and man. Covenant theology is more than an idea, it is the heart of correct biblical interpretation. Reformed theology stands on covenant theology, because it stands on the Bible as properly read and understood."
